Flood Mitigation - initial flood investigation reports including but not limited to S19 have identified that a further £20 million is needed to complete mitigation and response work. This would include working with landowners setting up retention ponds, supporting water catchment projects and improving highways. The council has written to the Flooding Minister, Emma Hardy MP, seeking funds to plug the funding gap.

Agri-tech Grant Funding - Suffolk organisations are invited to apply for a share of £2.5 million for business-led agrifood projects in Eastern England. There are two strands:

- The first competition, 'MFA', is open to micro, small and medium sized businesses. Grants between £25,000 and £100,000 are available for projects lasting 6 to 12 months.
- The second competition is for collaborative research and development (CR&D) projects.
 Applications can be led by any sized business, consortia must include at least one small or medium enterprise. Grants between £150,000 and £300,000 are available.

Projects can focus on one or more of the following themes:

- enhancing the productivity of primary crops, livestock, aquaculture or ornamental crops
- biotechnologies related to agriculture, aquaculture, food processing and nutrition
- food that promotes safe, lower carbon or more sustainable healthy and nutritious diets
- resource efficient production and processing methods for low emission foods.

Culture Project Grants - This initiative is aimed at strengthening and supporting local arts and museum projects in our local communities across the county, particularly those affected by general reductions in arts funding. The fund offers three tiers of grants:

Small grants up to £1,500; Medium grants up to £15,000; Large grants up to £50,000

Eligible applicants include Arts and Museum organisations, skilled freelancers, registered charities, community interest companies, non-profits, and social enterprises based in Suffolk. The deadline for applications over £1,500 is 12 noon Thursday 29 November 2024.

Projects (NSIPs). The new guidance - <u>Community Engagement and Wellbeing Supplementary</u> <u>Guidance</u> - complements the council's Energy and Climate Adaptive Infrastructure Policy, and is aimed at project promoters, parish councils and local communities.
